- ......met at Woodland Elementary School.
- ......organized as the Board of School Trustees for 2015. The oath of office was administered to recently re-elected Board members Karen Carter, Glenn Duncan and Jeri Stahr.
- ......elected Carolyn Morris to serve as president, Glenn Duncan to serve as vice president, and Susan Diaber as secretary of the Board of School Trustees for 2015.
- ......publicly disclosed potential conflicts of interest for Mrs. Carter, Mr. Duncan, Dorisanne Nielsen, Ms. Stahr, and Doug Weaver. Mrs. Carter reported Board members pay for their insurance and pay the same premiums as all other employees.
- ......heard from Superintendent's Student Advisory Council (SSAC) representatives Rachel Swanson from Central High School (CHS) and Michael Foy from Memorial High School (MHS). Rachel, a junior at Central, is active in soccer, band and is Social Chair of her class. She reported upcoming events: a blood drive; swim meets and senior night; SSAC's goal for the food drive is 50,000 pounds of food; SSAC juniors are planning a leadership conference for this summer; and SSAC freshmen and sophomores are preparing emergency kits for ECS 3<sup>rd</sup> graders. Michael, a junior at Memorial reports: tardy lock outs for every period are in effect to try to cut down on activity in the hallways; MHS graduates came back to show a video and talk with all freshmen girls about "girl on girl violence"; and current sports are basketball, swimming and wrestling with state wrestling occurring at the end of January.

......heard a Building Energy Report from Ted Foland, Energy Education Specialist. Woodland leads all classroom buildings in cost avoidance percentages and all elementary buildings in cost avoidance dollars. It is their fourth consecutive year with a cost avoidance of above 52% valued at over \$364,000.00

......heard Jonathan LeVan, Principal of Woodland Elementary School, report on how proud he is of his staff and parents. He introduced present staff and Parents Activities Council members. He highlighted and gave examples of demographics, educational programming, college and career readiness, family involvement, special programs, ISTEP performance data which showed measurable improvements, discipline data, and ended with school improvement focus.

......approved an extra-curricular purchase of a sound system for West Side Middle School to be used for all music department concerts as well as assemblies which need microphones and speakers. It would also be used in the classrooms every day in order to supplement the sound coming from the computer. The West Side orchestra and choir will each pay \$2,527.00 from their extracurricular accounts. The Board also approved the purchase of 6 flutes, 5 trumpets, and 5 trombones, valued at \$5,967.00 from the West Side Band extracurricular account.

......confirmed the submission of a United Way Innovation Grant to support Career Camp for middle school students.

.......confirmed the submission of an Indiana Department of Education 1003 (a) Tier IV AdvanceD Options grants for Beck Elementary School and Pierre Moran Middle School to provide resources to write an effective school improvement plan and build leadership capacity partnering with AdvanceD using the ASSIST program.
