Dr. Thalheimer showed Board members the Indiana Department of Education (IDOE) Graduates Preparing to Succeed (GPS) dashboard which was released to the public today. This dashboard is a new performance accountability piece for all of Indiana schools, pre-k through grade 12. The dashboard focuses on five indicators, identified by the State, of a student's preparation for success after high school including academic mastery; career and postsecondary readiness (credentials and experience); communication and collaboration; work ethic; and civic, financial, and digital literacy. There are four sections broken down as follows: pre-k – grade 2; grades 3 – 8; grades 9 – 12; and graduation and beyond. For each of these sections there is data to show where Indiana is today and where they are going. This same information can be displayed for an individual school district as well as an individual school. Dr. Thalheimer encouraged Board members and the community to take a look at www.indianagps.doe.in.gov/.

Dr. Thalheimer provided an update on the Demographics and Feasibility Study which will be a standing agenda item going forward. The Key Committee met for the first time on December 1, 2022. SchoolIQ explained the process as we began with a look at ECS's buildings over the summer. Next, we are looking at the community's perception of ECS through the release of several surveys. These surveys are available and are being advertised on Elkhart Community School's website at www.elkhart.k12.in.us, Facebook, flyers, all-calls, etc. In response to Board inquiry, Dr. Thalheimer would confirm with the communications department to make sure the link is put on individual schools' websites/Facebook, PTO websites/Facebook, etc. The administration and Board members encouraged the whole community to engage in this process. In response to public inquiry, the Board and administration assured them that the Key Committee mirrored the diversity of our school district.
