........... heard Amy Stine, lead teacher at Elkhart High School (EHS) School of Arts and Communication share a Moment of Pride. First she thanked Board members for approving their fundraiser and invited them to attend the event which will be held in conjunction with the 45th Madrigal dinner on December 3, 2022. The Arts and Communications Market, named and created by the students, will feature local vendors and student showcases across all content areas. All funds raised will be used to provide positive behavior incentives for students. Currently they have ten (10) outside vendors and seven (7) student groups who have committed to the event, and they expect more to come.

Brittany Townsley, language arts content area specialist at EHS School of Arts and Communication, shared that teachers have been planning during PLC time for the Arts and Communication Market, working to create an all-inclusive PBL event across all content areas. ........... heard Superintendent Steve Thalheimer update Board members about the Indiana Department of Education (IDOE) and their efforts to reduce the academic standards by

twenty-five percent (25%) in response to changes in State law. Recommended standard reductions are to be presented to the Indiana State Board of Education for review by June 2023 for grades 9 – 12 and June 2024 for grades K – 8. The results will then change State assessments for grades 9 – 12 for the 2024 – 2025 school year and K – 8 for the 2025 – 2026 school year. Content Connectors are also being reduced/reviewed for all grade levels and be implemented for the 2025-2026 school year.

In 2018, the IDOE revised standards breaking them down into skills which made it feel as if they created more standards/expectations. It was determined there were too many standards and not enough instructional time to adequately cover them which led to the "essential" standards movement. ECS currently uses essential standards in the PLC process, as teachers identified these standards to ensure students know and can do said standards by the end of the school year, created common formative assessments (CFA) around these standards, and provided support to those students who have not mastered these standards and extensions for those who have.

The IDOE has already created an ILEARN blueprint defining the essential content measured on the assessment and identifying the critical standards that will more than likely be covered on the test. Since the pandemic, they have also identified standards, containing both content and skills essential for students' success, for which data shows students are performing below expectations state-wide. ECS can now take this information and compare it with the essential standards they have identified in their PLCs to help further direct their instruction.

The IDOE is looking to speed up the original timeline for seeking approval of standards reductions and STEM Standards to June of 2023 for all of K - 12; June – December of 2023 they will work in committee and allow public comment for Content Connectors; December 2023, SBOE meets to approve Content Connectors; and January – May 2024 vendor will update documents, guidelines for standards and Content Connectors. Everything will roll out in the 2024-2025 school year including revised ILEARN assessments.

In closing, Dr. Thalheimer informed the Board as the IDOE works to reduce the standards there will be opportunities for ECS to review, provide feedback and contribute to the work throughout the process. He expects the first opportunity for further to provide feedback around April or May, prior to June approval from the SBOE.

Dr. Sheppard, assistant superintendent of instruction, provided an update on the resource adoption committees. This year's adoptions include Social Studies and World Languages curriculum materials. The initial meeting to explain the process has already been held for both committees. The content area specialists for Social Studies and the committee for World Languages are in the process of creating a rubric for the committee to review. Material will begin to arrive shortly. After the rubrics are approved by the committee, they will begin reviewing materials and identifying which vendors they would like to come and present to the group in January. Brenda Kolbe, director of communications, will help to communicate the process providing all stakeholders an opportunity to review materials and provide feedback. Dr. Sheppard will continue to update the Board as the committees move through this process.

To follow, the administration will work with them to determine how to best bridge social workers' current compensation policy to something similar to the bargaining unit's compensation plan.
