Total savings from September 2009 thru today is valued at 3.8 million dollars.

As we approach the end of the current budget year, I am in the process of evaluating our fund appropriations and anticipated revenue to cover such appropriations.

All of our "state approved" funds are experiencing revenue shortfalls. I am anticipating that it will be necessary for Elkhart Schools to request an additional appropriation in our Rainy Day Fund to support one or more of our funds that appear to be in danger of lacking funds to support necessary appropriations.

I plan to come to the Board in the November 26<sup>th</sup> Board meeting to request your authorization to publish legal notice of a public hearing to consider one or more proposed additional appropriations for the purposes outlined above. The public hearing would need to occur in the December 10<sup>th</sup> Board meeting.

You might recall that Elkhart Schools requested an additional appropriation in the Rainy Day Fund last year since the amount of the final distribution of property tax revenue was uncertain. As it turned out, the final distribution was sufficient to cover our necessary appropriations and the Rainy Day Fund appropriation was not utilized. I anticipate that we will need to draw on funds from the Rainy Day Fund prior to the end of the current budget year.
