Riverview, Pierre Moran, and West Side chiller replacement project recommendations will be brought to the Board later in the agenda for New classroom locksets have been installed at Beck, approval. All 25 programs offer college credit and industrial certification. Additional programs and courses offered in 2015-16 will be diesel technology with CDL certification, veterinarian assistant, college trigonometry, and college literature. Health Care Support Technology in 2015-16 and Health Care Support Associate's Degree 60 cr. hrs. in 2016-17 are scheduled as part of Elkhart's Early College Initiative. The Advanced Manufacturing and Automation Program hope to become part of a Polytechnic Institute. EACC's school improvement plan includes; expanding school and community outreach; continuing program evaluation which includes teacher self assessments; and setting school goals, focusing on how to measure and monitor. 12 of EACC's staff presented at a national summer conference and requests to visit our campus shows the quality of our Career Center. In response to Board inquiry, Dr. Benak stated he would investigate the possibilities of partnering the EMT program with the Elkhart General Hospital program. Principal Matt Werbiansky shared his excitement working at EACC and his pride in a class which is working on a project to solve the Wi-Fi problems at the Elkhart County Fair. They will present their solution to the Fair Board.

# RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SCHOOL TRUSTEES ELKHART COMMUNITY SCHOOLS

WHEREAS, the Board of School Trustees for the Elkhart Community Schools represents Elkhart, Indiana's public school interest in providing educational programs in a safe learning environment which develop knowledgeable, healthy, socially responsible citizens in the global community, and

WHEREAS, the Elkhart Community Schools (hereafter ECS) owns 112 acres of agriculture land through which Cobus Creek Flows (hereafter Cobus Farm); and

WHEREAS, ECS purchased Cobus Farm for the purpose of providing educational opportunities including, but not limited to, aquatics, environmental, and agricultural science; and

WHEREAS, said educational opportunities take place, at times, in areas on Cobus Farm proximate to and or in, on, or involving the water of Cobus Creek; and

WHEREAS, a permit will be issued to place a wastewater treatment facility in Ontwa Township, Cass County, Michigan; and

WHEREAS, the permit authorizes an increased loading of pollutants to Cobus Creek which will lower the water quality; and

WHEREAS, the permit is being granted based on alleged social and economic development in the area; and

WHEREAS, the proposed wastewater treatment facility will discharge into Cobus Creek; and

WHEREAS, said treatment facility is located less than 5,000 feet upstream from Cobus Farm; and

WHEREAS, the proposed location of the wastewater treatment facility is in such close proximity to Cobus Farm owned by ECS that its operation could create potentially hazardous effects on children and the future educational and social development of the immediate area;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of School Trustees for the Elkhart Community Schools hereby OPPOSES the aforementioned water treatment proposal given the potential risk to children participating in ECS educational programs at Cobus Farm.

THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of School Trustees for the Elkhart Community Schools hereby requests and calls upon other governmental regulating bodies to recognize the charge of stewardship to the residents and electors of their particular governmental body and to take such action necessary to oppose this proposal as not being worthy in light of the potential risks to ECS students participating in educational programs at Cobus Farm, and potential environmental consequences.
