President Dorisanne Nielsen called the regular meeting of the Board of School Trustees to order. The pledge of allegiance was recited.

Mrs. Nielsen discussed the invitation to speak protocol.

DBA Kauffman Laundry, to support transportation costs for future field trips; a check for \$250.00 from Gurley Leep Automotive Family, Driven To Give Event for the Celebrating Excellence Gifts and Donations fund; a donation of several graphical and electrical items with an approximate market value of \$9,000.00 from Bayer HealthCare to be used in the Career Center's graphic design and automation and engineering programs; and \$500.00 from an anonymous donor for Central athletics to assist in strengthening the growth of its' programs.

Doug Hasler, executive director of support services, reported the following fund loans were made on August 29, 2014: \$35,000.00 to Debt Services Fund from Bus Replacement Fund.

Doug Hasler explained the formal budget presentation had been given at the August 26th Board meeting and as a result, public hearings were authorized for this meeting.

President Nielsen opened a public hearing on the proposed 2015 Budget. Hearing no comments from the audience members, President Nielsen declared the hearing was closed.

President Nielsen opened a public hearing on the proposed 2015 School Bus Replacement Plan. Hearing no comments from the audience members, President Nielsen declared the hearing was closed.

Public Hearing

By unanimous action, the Board approved the proposal from Lake City Bank to provide banking services for a two year period. Mr. Hasler explained six proposals were received. In response to Board inquiry, he explained the criteria required for each proposal. In addition to those requirements, Lake City Bank was the best overall choice based on the availability of fully functional remote deposit technology, preparation of bank statements with summarized totals of transaction activity, and proximity of full service branches.

Cash Management

By unanimous action, the Board approved proposed school fundraisers in accordance with Board policy.

By unanimous action, the Board approved proposed revisions and waived second reading to Board Policy GDBA - 8, Registered Nurses Compensation Plan, which will compensate nurses for the longer work day. There will be no change in their hourly pay rate and the change is retroactive to August 8, 2014.

Board Policy GDBA - 8 By unanimous action, the Board approved proposed revisions to the 2014-2015 Board of School Trustees Meeting Schedule as originally approved at the March 25, 2014 Board meeting. The work session on September 16, 2014 needed to be changed to September 30, 2014 due to Board members attending a state conference. 2014-15 Board Meeting Schedule

By unanimous action, the Board approved submission of an Indiana Department of Education Grant for Excellence in Performance Awards. Dr. John Hill, assistant superintendent for instruction, explained this grant recognizes the achievement of teachers who taught in Priority or Focus Schools during the 2013-14 school year and who were rated effective or highly effective in the teacher evaluation system. TAX NEUTRALITY RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Indiana Code 20-48-1-2, as originally enacted, provided that each year that a pension debt service levy is needed for purposes of funding retirement or severance liabilities, a school corporation must reduce the total property tax levy for the school corporation's transportation, school bus replacement, capital projects, art association and historical society funds in an amount equal to the property tax levy needed for the pension debt service;

WHEREAS, IC 20-48-1-2 was amended by Section 27 of HEA 1192 (2012) to allow school corporations with retirement or severance bond liability to reduce the amount of the tax neutrality reduction otherwise required;

WHEREAS, IC 20-48-1-2 now authorizes school corporations to reduce the amount of the tax neutrality reduction by specified percentages in budget years 2013, 2014, and 2015 upon the adoption of a resolution;

WHEREAS, absent modification of the full tax neutrality reduction, the ability of Elkhart Community Schools to fulfill the purposes of its Capital Projects Fund and School Bus Replacement Fund would be significantly impaired due to reduction in the certified levies of such funds;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SCHOOL TRUSTEES OF ELKHART COMMUNITY SCHOOLS that the tax neutrality adjustment percentage for property taxes first due and payable in 2013 be 25%, 50% in 2014, and 75% in 2015, with the balance of such adjustments being allocated between its Capital Projects Fund, Transportation Operating Fund, and its Bus Replacement Fund (in proportions specified by the Executive Director of Support Services) for budget year 2015.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT Elkhart Community Schools shall strive to achieve a percentage of expenditure for academic achievement and student instructional support during fiscal year 2015 that is equal to 64.1% or greater.

We have reviewed the bids submitted on September 8, 2014 for the 2014 Elkhart School Mechanical Physical Plant Improvement project and find no irregularities. The apparent low bidder was Project Design & Piping with a base bid amount of \$1,109,900. An alternate bid item to replace the urinals at Pierre Moran Elementary was also provide with an additional cost of \$24,380 as well as an alternate bid to replace an inline pump at Pierre Moran for \$15,125. In combination, the total bid amount from Project Design & Piping is \$1,149,405, which is within the anticipated budget for the project.
