Board president Dacey Davis called the regular meeting of the Board of School Trustees to order.

Call to Order

Board member Kellie Mullins recited the Elkhart Promise.

The Elkhart Promise

Board president Davis discussed the invitation to speak protocol.

Moment of Pride

Dan Burton, band director at Pierre Moran Middle School, presented the Moment of Pride. He began by introducing Dean Ferguson, Elkhart Municipal Band, who shared the story of how it all began. A member of the band left the band money which they used to form a not-for-profit to support the city's band program. The original idea started when Candy and Craig Henkler, members of Grace Lutheran Church, and Mr. Ferguson came up with the idea to share their love of music by providing instruments and weekly private lessons to Pierre Moran students. Currently there are ten (10) students and three (3) teachers participating in the program. Grace Lutheran Church offers a place to hold the lessons as well as adult supervision for every lesson. Mr. Ferguson then schedules teachers (Vickie Marshall, Steve Allen, and Jeanine Bilik) from the Elkhart Municipal Band to provide the private lessons for students once a week. Each participating student must sign a commitment form and have a parent/quardian to transport them to and from their lessons. Paige VanNevel, 7th grade flute player at Pierre Moran, shared that the lessons were fun, have improved her playing and she sounds so much better. Mr. Burton hopes to expand the program as he retires and expressed his appreciation for all who make this program work.

By unanimous action, the Board postponed consideration of the proposed revisions to Board Policy 5340.01 – Student Concussion and Sudden Cardiac Arrest until March 22, 2022.

Board Policy 5340.01

By unanimous action, the Board approved proposed revisions to Board Policy 5540 – The Schools and Governmental Agencies including Board recommendations from the February 22, 2022 Board meeting.

Board Policy 5540

By unanimous action, the Board approved proposed revisions to Board Policy 7540.03 – Network and Internet Acceptable Use and Safety as presented at the February 22, 2022 Board meeting.

Board Policy 7540.03

The Board was presented revisions to Administrative Regulation JC – School District Boundaries for initial consideration. The proposed boundary changes are only necessary if the repurposing of Hawthorne is approved. In response to Board inquiry, Doug Thorne, district counsel/chief of staff, responded that the schools impacted are Beardsley, Beck, Daly, Hawthorne, Monger, Riverview, and Roosevelt.

Administrative Regulation JC Superintendent Thalheimer informed Board members that EHS's boundary description would be updated for the second reading on March 22, 2022.

By unanimous action (Enfield abstained), the Board approved proposed revisions and waived second reading to Board Policy 3422.06S – Secretarial/Business Compensation Plan. Mr. Thorne informed Board members that the revision reclassified an executive assistant position to a secretary class 5 position which brings it in line with other departments. In response to Board inquiry, Mr. Thorne informed the Board that checks and balances are in place to control the use of overtime, per Board policy, as all overtime must be authorized by Kevin Scott, chief financial officer.

Board Policy 3422.06S

By unanimous action, the Board approved proposed revisions and waived second reading to Board Policy 3430.01A – Leave of Absence. Mr. Thorne explained the revisions bring administrator personal business benefits in line with the Master Contract language allowing for benefits to accumulate.

Board Policy 3430.01A

The Board was presented a proposed new Board Policy 3432.01ACS – Family Care Leave for initial consideration. Mr. Thorne informed the Board this policy is specifically for those employees who may not have benefits available to them, are not entitled to FMLA, or may work less than four (4) hours. This will enable an employee to take an unpaid leave versus having to resign and reapply for a position. In response to Board inquiry, Mr. Thorne noted it is initially for a thirty (30) day period but the employee would have the option to reapply up to a maximum of sixty (60) days. In response to Board inquiry, Mr. Thorne responded that allowing for intermittent days is very difficult to track, but can be considered. Mr. Thorne will work with payroll and human resources and bring the policy back for a second reading on March 22, 2022.

Board Policy 3432.01ACS

Board president Davis suspended the Board meeting and opened the 1028 hearing. Mr. Scott provided information about the projects as well as the funding of said projects. Board president Davis asked for public comment and there was one speaker. Following public comment, Board president Davis closed the hearing and resumed the Board meeting.

By unanimous action, the Board adopted a Resolution Confirming the Lease Approving the 2022 Bonds and Related to Matters – Monger and Mary Daly Elementary Renovation Project. (Codified File 119) Resolution

An audience member spoke against the repurposing of Hawthorne Elementary School.

From the Audience

An audience member spoke against the repurposing of Hawthorne Elementary School as well as concerns about the possibility of changes in the population in the future which could cause overcrowding in the schools. She feels it would be cheaper to invest in Hawthorne now.

An audience member spoke against the repurposing of Hawthorne Elementary School and the impact it will have on students and families.

An audience member read a letter against the repurposing of Hawthorne Elementary School and the impact it will have on the students, families, and community.

An audience member spoke about Hawthorne Elementary School being the heart of the community and called on the administration to hear all of the community concerns prior to making a decision. In the end, he hopes whatever decision is made will be good for the kids and Elkhart.

An audience member spoke against the repurposing of Hawthorne Elementary School and expressed concerns as to why building improvements were not done to Hawthorne over the years.

Superintendent Thalheimer spoke about working with the Board to schedule an informational meeting next week regarding the repurposing of Hawthorne Elementary School and the revised district boundary lines. The administration will advertise via social media, local news, and communication through the schools.

Superintendent Thalheimer informed the Board he spoke to a couple of the vendors who gave him an estimate of six (6) to eight (8) months to complete the RFP study of the district.

Board member Doug Weaver spoke about the AF JROTC Drill and Color Guard Competition on March 11 – 14, 2022.

Board member Weaver spoke about the AF JROTC formal.

Board member Babette Boling shared that it was International Women's Day. May we be them. May we raise them.

The meeting adjourned at approximately 8:13 p.m.

5340.01 - STUDENT CONCUSSIONS AND SUDDEN CARDIAC ARREST

Student Concussions

It is the policy of the Board the that risk of student injury be considered and addressed in the planning and implementation of every student activity sponsored by the Board. The Board therefore directs and requires, before beginning practice for an interscholastic and/or intramural sports activity, including cheerleading, the coach of the activity shall provide to each student athlete and his/her parent (unless the student is at least age eighteen (18) or is an emancipated minor) an information sheet on Concussion and Head Injury and an acknowledgement form issued by the Indiana Department of Education (IDOE). Additionally, the Board shall require the student athlete and his/her parent (unless the student is at least age eighteen (18) or is an emancipated minor) to either electronically sign and submit or sign and return the form acknowledging the receipt of information from the IDOE Indiana Department of Education on Concussions and Head Injury.

A student athlete who participates in an interscholastic and/or intramural sports activity, including cheerleading, and is suspected of sustaining a concussion or head injury in a practice or game shall be removed from play at the time of the injury and may not return to play until s/he has been seen and evaluated by a licensed health care provider trained in the evaluation and management of concussions and head injuries, the coach receives a written clearance from the licensed healthcare provider who evaluated the student athlete confirming s/he can safely return to participation in the sport or activity, and not less than twenty-four (24) hours have passed since s/he was removed from play.

The athletic department shall maintain the original of the written clearance from the health care provider for the student athlete to return to play for no less than three (3) years after the student reaches age eighteen (18).

Student Sudden Cardiac Arrest

The Board also directs and requires, before beginning practice for an interscholastic and/or intramural sports activity, including cheerleading, marching band, or other extracurricular activity in which students have an increased risk of sudden cardiac arrest as determined by the IDOE, the coach of the activity or marching band leader shall provide to each applicable student athlete and his/her parent (unless the student is at least age eighteen (18) or is an emancipated minor) an information sheet on Sudden Cardiac Arrest and acknowledgement form issued by the IDOE Indiana Department of Education. Further, the

Board shall require the <u>applicable</u> student <u>athlete</u> and his/her parent (unless the student is at least age eighteen (18) or is an emancipated minor) to <u>either electronically sign and submit or</u> sign and return to the coach <u>or marching band leader</u> the form acknowledging the receipt of the information from the <u>IDOE Indiana Department of Education</u> on Sudden Cardiac Arrest.

The <u>athletic and music departments coach</u> shall maintain an original <u>or electronic copy</u> of the signed acknowledgement for each student and shall not allow the <u>applicable</u> student <u>athlete</u> to participate in the <u>activity sport until either</u> the <u>electronically signed or signed acknowledgement form from the parent and student is properly executed and returned.</u>

A student athlete who participates in an interscholastic and/or intramural sports activity, including cheerleading, and is suspected of sustaining a concussion or head injury in a practice or game shall be removed from play at the time of the injury and may not return to play until s/he has been seen and evaluated by a licensed health care provider trained in the evaluation and management of concussions and head injuries, the coach receives a written clearance from the licensed healthcare provider who evaluated the student athlete confirming s/he can safely return to participation in the sport or activity, and not less than twenty four (24) hours have passed since s/he was removed from play.

The athletic department A coach shall maintain the original of the written clearance from the health care provider for the student athlete to return to play for no less than three (3) years after the student reaches age eighteen (18). [DLS1]

An applicable A-student athlete who participates in an interscholastic and/or intramural sports activity, including cheerleading, marching band, or other extracurricular competitive or noncompetitive activity in which students have an increased risk of sudden cardiac arrest as determined by the IDOE, and is suspected, as determined by a game official, coach of the applicable student's team, licensed athletic trainer, physician assistant, advanced practiced registered nurse, licensed physician, marching band leader, or other official designated by the applicable student's school, of experiencing a symptom of sudden cardiac arrest in a practice or an above activity game shall be removed from practice or play at the time the symptom is identified, and the parent or legal quardian of the applicable student athlete shall be notified of the applicable student's athlete's symptoms (unless the student is at least age eighteen (18) or is an emancipated minor). An applicable A student athlete—who has been removed from practice or play may not return to practice or play until twenty-four (24)hours has elapsed since the symptom is identified and the coach/sponsor, marching band leader, or other official designated by the applicable student's school has received verbal-written permission from a parent of the student (or from the student if the student is at least age eighteen (18) or is an emancipated minor) for him/her to return to practice and play. Within twenty four (24) hours after giving verbal permission for the applicable student athlete to return to practice and play, the parent (or the student if the student is at least age eighteen (18) or is an emancipated minor) must provide the coach, marching band leader, or other official designated by the school with a written statement confirming the student has permission to return to practice and play.

A coach <u>The athletic and music departments</u> shall maintain the original of the written statement confirming the student has permission to return to practice and play for no less than three (3) years after the student reaches age eighteen (18).

Each coach <u>or marching band leader</u> of an interscholastic and/or intramural sports activity, <u>including</u> cheerleading, <u>marching band</u>, <u>or other extracurricular activity</u> shall <u>participate in a receive</u> training <u>course</u> on concussions, sudden cardiac arrest (including the symptoms), <u>and</u> cardiopulmonary resuscitation <u>as</u> determined by the IDOE, and the use of an automated external defibrillator.

3432.01ACS - FAMILY CARE LEAVE

Family Care Leave is an unpaid leave available to employees of Elkhart Community Schools who are not eligible for any other leave under applicable board policy or under the terms of a collective bargaining agreement approved by the Board of School Trustees.

- A. <u>Types of Leaves</u> Elkhart Community Schools will provide up to thirty (30) calendar days of unpaid Family Care Leave to eligible, qualified employees on a rolling twelve-month period for the following reasons:
 - New Child Leave To care for the employee's son or daughter immediately following the birth of such child or to care for a child placed with the employee for adoption or foster care.
 - 2. <u>Family Care Leave</u> To care for the employee's spouse, son, daughter or parent with a "serious health condition."
- B. <u>Eligible Employees</u> An employee is eligible for Family Care Leave only if they have completed probation and been employed by Elkhart Community Schools for at least ninety (90) calendar days (inclusive of the employee's probationary period).
- C. <u>Serious Health Condition</u> A "serious health condition" is defined as an injury, illness, or physical or mental condition requiring inpatient hospital care or ongoing treatment by a physician.
- D. Manner in Which Leave May Be Taken
 - 1. New Child Leave must be taken immediately following the birth of an employee's son or daughter or the placement of a child with the employee for adoption or foster care. New Child Leave must be taken continuously.
 - Family Care Leave must be taken continuously.as follows

- a. Continuous an employee may take up to thirty (30) calendar days of unpaid leave on a rolling twelve (12) month period or
- b. Intermittent an employee may take up to twenty (20) workdays of intermittent unpaid leave within a school year for medical appointments, treatments, direct care for a family member, etc. Intermittent leaves must be taken in whole day increments.

E. Requests for Leave

If an employee would like an absence to be considered Family Care Leave under this policy, they must provide Elkhart Community Schools with sufficient documentation from the treating physician to support a determination that the leave meets the qualifications for Family Care Leave. Family Care Leave request forms are available in Human Resources.

Requests for Family Care Leave must be submitted at least thirty (30) calendar days prior to the first date of the requested leave, when possible. If the need for Family Care Leave is not foreseeable thirty (30) calendar days in advance, then the request must be submitted as soon as the need becomes foreseeable. An employee who is unable to provide advance notice and believes their absence would qualify for Family Care Leave must notify Human Resources of his or her intent to request such a leave within two (2) workdays of becoming aware of the need for leave.

In the event both spouses are employed by Elkhart Community Schools, they would share the thirty (30) calendar day continuous leave or twenty (20) workday intermittent entitlement.

If the employee does not provide a request for leave in accordance with the above provisions, the absence will not be considered Family Care Leave.

F. <u>Medical Certification</u>

- 1. <u>Certification Form</u> If an employee requests a Family Care Leave, the leave must be supported by medical documentation from the treating physician. The employee is responsible for securing the required medical documentation from the treating physician and returning it to Human Resources along with an application for Family Care Leave (or if the leave is not foreseeable, within the time frame set by Elkhart Community Schools).
- 2. <u>Verification of Certification</u> When Elkhart Community Schools has reason to doubt the validity of medical documentation provided by the employee, Elkhart Community Schools may require a second or third medical opinion. Additionally, Elkhart Community Schools may require further medical documentation from the employee on a reasonable basis.
- G. <u>Exhaustion of Paid Time Off as Part of Leave</u> Employees must have exhausted all available paid benefits prior to the commencement of a Family Care Leave.
- H. Pay During Leave All Family Care Leaves are unpaid.

- I. <u>Health Insurance Benefits While on Leave</u> Employees on an unpaid <u>New Child Leave or continuous</u> Family Care Leave, who are participating in the district's health insurance plan, are responsible for the payment of the full cost of insurance premiums while on leave.
- J. <u>Keeping Elkhart Community Schools Informed</u> An employee must keep Elkhart Community Schools informed of his/her leave of absence status while on leave, including his/her intent to return to Elkhart Community Schools at the end of the leave. Failure to keep Elkhart Community Schools advised may be cause for termination of employment.
- K. <u>Reinstatement</u> Employees returning from a Family Care Leave must contact Human Resources at least one (1) week in advance of the projected return date. If the requested family care leave is for the employee's own health condition, the employee must provide documentation from his/her medical provider releasing the employee to return to work to the Human Resources. Documentation must be provided prior to the employee's return to work.

When an employee returns from Family Care Leave, Elkhart Community Schools will restore the employee to the position he or she held when the leave commenced or to an equivalent position with equivalent benefits.



In March 2021, the board set the transfer tuition rate at \$6,600. The actual tuition rate for 2022-23 will be close to \$6,900. The state reimbursement rate includes Tuition Support and the Complexity Grant and has not been adjusted for "Other" spending reductions on the form SA545. State support is \$6,924.77 for 2021-22.

The recommended tuition rate for students in grades K-12 for the 2022-2023 school year is \$6,900.00.
