This is just one way our district continues to shape our community's bright future.

3241 - DISCUSSION

In order to maintain effective day-to-day communications and sustain an effective and positive relationship with the Elkhart Teachers Association ("ETA") through continuing dialogue, the Superintendent of Schools has established a committee, hereinafter referred to as the Professional Relations Group ("PRG").

The purpose of PRG is to discuss and explore topics referred to PRG by the Superintendent and the President of the ETA. PRG's purpose is to serve as the venue for discussion regarding concerns impacting the district at large. PRG shall be authorized, by mutual agreement, to make recommendations on those issues after they have been discussed, explored, and studied.

Issues addressing a single building are expected to be addressed through building-level discussion. Building-level administrators are expected to meet with the Exclusive Representative at the building level on a monthly basis for the purpose of discussions, and to provide minutes of these meetings to the ETA President and District Counsel/Chief of Staff.

PRG shall have no authority to change, delete or modify any of the terms of the Master Contract entered into by ETA and ECS; nor to settle grievances arising under the Master Contract.

Members of PRG shall include the Superintendent, District Counsel/Chief of Staff, and three (3) administrators appointed annually by the Superintendent; along with the ETA President and four (4) teachers appointed annually by the ETA President.

Meetings shall be held on the third Monday during the school term, and at other times when mutually agreed upon by the Superintendent and ETA President. The agenda shall be prepared in advance of the meeting by submitting proposed agenda items to the District Counsel/ Chief of Staff.
