Board President Troy Scott called the regular meeting of the Board of School Trustees to order.

Call to Order

Mr. Scott recited the Elkhart Promise.

The Elkhart Promise

One (1) audience member spoke of concerns regarding the transition of sixth grade from elementary schools to middle schools.

Public Comment

Ellen Williams, Elkhart Education Foundation (EEF) Executive Director, provided an update to EEF's commitment to public education, specifically Elkhart Community Schools (ECS). EEF has been very busy supporting ECS this past summer offering two (2) programs to support ECS students, SummerScape and Catalyst. SummerScape was a day camp housed at Roosevelt STEAM Academy which directly supported the ECS summer school curriculum through fun activities with a particular focus on literacy. The second program, Catalyst, an internship program in partnership with Notre Dame. This was the sixth year with interns from Elkhart High School (EHS) as well as EHS graduates who are in college. There are four (4) teams that support four (4) different industries or units of governments working on a problem/project to be solved. These teams learn to gather information, put an effective survey together, implement the survey, and close out the summer with a poster and verbal presentation.

Elkhart Education Foundation

EEF has moved into the school year with a focus on a middle school program called Spark. Spark is a literacy-based afterschool program currently operating at Pierre Moran and North Side, and they hope to offer it at West Side as well. Spark at Pierre Moran begins with the students choosing a book to read together and then they create artwork and other fun projects to expand their knowledge about what they have read. Spark at North Side is very different as they partner with the Wellfield Botanic Gardens. Students learn about the science of climate and environment while seeing it come to life by growing their own plants. Ms. Williams hopes to tell the Board about Spark at West Side the next time she provides an update.

EEF's biggest initiative this fall is the Schoolhouse Supply Store which ensures all ECS students have the supplies they need to set them up to be successful in school. They also offer a "teacher's wish list" to help teachers obtain supplies for their classrooms.

Ms. Williams invited Board members to EEF's 10-year anniversary celebration on October 10, 2024, from 6 – 8 p.m. at EHS in the ETI building. This event will be a true celebration showcasing ECS students where they will sing, play instruments, and display artwork. Kelly Berheide, recently retired principal and new EEF Board Member, will then provide a quick tour of ETI followed by a performance by the EHS marching band.

In closing, Ms. Williams informed Board members of the upcoming Annual Ugly Christmas Sweater 5K Run on December 7, 2024 at the NIBCO Ice Arena.

Erin Wagler, Director of Communication, shared some of the wonderful things happening in ECS during the Excellence of Elkhart highlighting Academics, Arts, and Athletics.

Excellence of Elkhart

In the area of Academics, reading is always an important focus for ECS, and schools are always finding creative ways to engage students with hands-on activities. This week, elementary schools welcomed guest readers into the classroom and then students used shaving cream to practice writing words and magnet boards to learn the alphabet.

Students are not the only ones learning at ECS. Over 400 teachers participated in LETRS professional development and learned new teaching methods to enhance students' reading and spelling skills.

Elkhart Area Career Center Automotive 1 students had the opportunity to work on an electric car, witnessing cutting edge automotive technology up close. EHS students participated in the Paydirt Conference hosted by the Elkhart County Soil and Water Conservation District. They met with local companies and were informed about opportunities available to those who have a drone license. Mr. Walsh's Aero class learned to use rocket design software to launch the rockets they created.

Saturday was the International Day of Peace and several ECS schools engaged in special activities to celebrate. The entire student body at

Pinewood Elementary made handmade signs and took part in a "Peace Walk" around Walker Park to promote peace, community, and understanding. What a great way to bring the school together and show the compassion of the Pinewood family.

In the area of Arts, Monger's 6th grade band and orchestra students began a new service project this past week. When they returned to school from their middle school music class, they reported to the library to assist kindergarten "buddies" with selecting a book and then read with their buddies! The kindergartners thought it was so cool to read with the "big kids" and the "big kids" took this leadership role very seriously.

Middle school band and orchestra students have been hard at work learning their instruments and practicing music for their November performance. We can't wait to hear their progress!

In the area of Athletics, EHS Athletics is all about building the leaders of tomorrow, and the Lions Student Athletic Council is a sterling example of this commitment. These students represent a wide variety of sports across EHS and are the ones behind initiatives which create a culture of excitement and togetherness around high school sports. The group recently traveled to Plymouth for the IHSAA Conference, where they heard keynote speeches from state athletic leaders, networked, and gathered new ideas to bring back to Elkhart.

Congratulations to EHS Boys Soccer Coach Todd Sheely on his 250th career win! Mr. Sheely also serves as the Director of the Indiana Olympic Development Program. ECS is proud to honor Mr. Sheely as an Excellence of Elkhart coach.

Mr. Thorne presented proposed revisions to Administrative Guideline 5200 – Student Attendance as presented during the September 10, 2024 Board meeting. Board members had no further comment.

By unanimous action, the Board approved proposed revisions to the 2024-2025 School Calendar as presented during the September 10, 2024 Board meeting. (Codified File 2425-037)

2024-2025 School Year Calendar

By unanimous action, the Board approved the administration's request to postpone consideration of proposed changes to Board policy 3422.08 – Paraprofessionals' Compensation Plan until November 26, 2024. This will allow the administration additional time to assure the compensation plan is transparent and provides competitive rates of pay and benefits for employees in this classification. The administration recognizes the employees in this classification have been waiting for these changes for some time; however, believes it is important to allow additional time to get the plan right. On November 26, 2024, the administration will be recommending the proposed compensation plan be retroactive to the beginning of the school year.

Board Policy 3422.08S

In response to Board inquiry, Mr. Thorne reiterated the proposed compensation plan the administration presents on November 26, 2024 will include language making the compensation plan retroactive to the beginning of the school year.

Board Policy 3422.09S

By unanimous action, the Board approved the administration's request to postpone consideration of proposed changes to Board policy 3422.09 – Technical Assistants' Compensation Plan until November 26, 2024. This will allow the administration additional time to assure the compensation plan is transparent and provides competitive rates of pay and benefits for employees in this classification. The administration recognizes the employees in this classification have been waiting for these changes for some time;

however, believes it is important to allow additional time to get the plan right. On November 26, 2024, the administration will be recommending the proposed compensation plan be retroactive to the beginning of the school year.

In response to Board inquiry, Mr. Thorne reiterated the proposed compensation plan the administration presents on November 26, 2024 will include language making the compensation plan retroactive to the beginning of the school year.

By unanimous action, the Board approved the Resolution regarding the transition of 6th grade students attending Elkhart Community Schools to transition from elementary schools to the district's middle schools effective the beginning of the 2025-2026 school year. (Codified File 2425-038)

New Course Proposals

By unanimous action, the Board approved Elkhart Area Career Center Agreements for 2024–2025 with the following feeder schools: Baugo Community Schools, Bremen Public Schools, Concord Community Schools, Edwardsburg Public Schools, Goshen Community Schools, Middlebury Community Schools, Penn-Harris-Madison Schools, School City of Mishawaka, and Wa-Nee Community Schools. In response to Board inquiry, Brandon Eakins, Director of Elkhart Area Career Center, informed the Board the contracts are with the same feeder schools they contracted with last school year. (Codified File 2425-040)

Elkhart Area Career Center Agreements

The Board received a financial report from Zac Quiett, Chief Financial Officer, for August 2024 and found it to be in order. Mr. Quiett noted August was a three (3) pay period month so there was an increase in spending this month causing a slight reduction in cash balance in both the operations and education fund. The operations fund will rebound in December with a large influx from local property tax disbursements.

Financial Report

Mr. Quiett reported the final request for reimbursement for ESSER was submitted and should be reflected in next month's financial reports.

In response to Board inquiry, Mr. Quiett reported the deadline for ESSER encumbrances is September 30, 2024; ECS is ahead of schedule as the last request for reimbursement has already been made.

The Board received an insurance update for the month of August 2024. Mr. Quiett reported claims experience continues to run slightly higher than projected. He shared he is optimistic ECS could see some reimbursement from the adjudication of the recent large claim a few months back but, as of right now, projections show a seven (7) to ten (10) percent increase in funding will be necessary for the self-insured plan next year.

Insurance Report

Dr. Huff shared it is College Go Week across the State of Indiana and Elkhart was ready to engage students at all levels in conversations about the importance of college in fun age-appropriate ways. Schools had College Go Spirit Week and a College Fair at the high school. Dr. Amy Rauch, Assistant Superintendent of Instruction, has been working with Goshen College to arrange campus visits for all 5th and 8th grade students.

From the Superintendent

Dr. Huff attended an elementary volleyball game and was very impressed with the teams as well as the number of supporters present. Elementary athletics are unique to Elkhart as other districts do not offer such programs.

On a serious note, Dr. Huff spoke about the recent social media threats towards schools taking place across the nation. ECS takes these threats seriously and emphasized that students who try to disrupt the school day with such threats will have severe consequences. He encouraged parents to have conversations with their students about saying and doing the right thing, both on and off campus. ECS's number one priority is to keep students safe.

In closing, Dr. Huff thanked the Board for attending the Indiana School Boards Association conference in Indianapolis where they learned about policy, heard from schools that have made tremendous success in reading achievement, spoke with Indiana legislators, and much more.

Mr. Scott added it was helpful to speak with other school boards and realize ECS is not the only district with struggles whether it be financial, policy, compliance, or security. He assured the public the ECS Board is committed to learn and continue to grow in an effort to bring the highest level of education and academics to students.

From the Board

Board Member Kellie Mullins added ECS received a shout out from the IHSAA, including compliments on the design of the elementary athletics, specifically the flag football program; they are considering starting girls' flag football. Mrs. Mullins also gave a special thank you and expressed appreciation to Mrs. Kathy Mow for the sacrifice she made when Mr. Mow returned as interim superintendent.

Board Member Jeff Bliler gave a shout out to Dr. Huff and the administrative team for addressing the social media threat so quickly.

The investigation resulted in things being very different from what was posted on social media. It was handled appropriately, and quick action was taken. Mr. Bliler shared that he came onto the Board as a strong advocate for safety and it was wonderful to see the progress that has been made. In closing, Mr. Bliler commended Board Member Anne VonDerVellen for her understanding of school finance as well as her ability to simplify information and share with fellow Board members. She is a great asset to the Board.

Mrs. VonDerVellen thanked Mr. Bliler and added that serving on the Board is a team effort. All Board members have their special gifts and strengths and have used them well to continue to help each other become better and grow as a Board.


