Study Classes

Please call in advance to reserve your seat for Orientation. Dates are subject to change.

Adult Basic Education orientation sessions are available in Elkhart. Students must register in advance.

Students must attend each day of their scheduled orientation session. Absences are not allowed. NO EXCEPTIONS.

Students must present state issued ID and social security card on the first day of orientation. Students without the required identification will not be allowed to participate in that week's orientation and will need to reschedule. NO EXCEPTIONS.

Students under 18 MUST schedule an appointment at 574-262-5678 and present the appropriate completed exit interview paperwork prior to the first day of orientation. Students without the appropriate paperwork will not be allowed to participate in that week's orientation and will need to reschedule. NO EXCEPTIONS. Exit interview packets are available at the Community Education office.

Students should plan to arrive 15 minutes prior to the start of orientation. Students will not be allowed into orientation after the start time.

HSE READINESS ASSESSMENT

Examinees receive a score in the form of a percentage that indicates the likelihood of passing the TASC test. In addition, the Readiness Assessment provides feedback on areas of weakness, allowing examinees to focus their efforts as they prepare for the test.

BASIC WELDING (CLASS I)

Students learn basic fundamentals of 1G, 2G, 1F and 2F positions. You will be introduced to stick arc welding, GTAW (TIG), GMAW-S and Spray (MIG), FCAU, Oxy-Acetylene cutting/welding (OAW)/brazing and plasma arc cutting (PAC). Students will be taught different welding techniques and how to weld Low Carbon Steel and Aluminum Alloys, read blueprints and interpret weld symbols. Students must arrive to class on time and remain on task. Time management skills are a must. Students are required to provide safety glasses, protective clothing (long sleeve shirt, long pants, close toe shoes or boots) and welding gloves.

ADVANCED WELDING (CLASS II)

Students will learn advanced fundamentals of 1G, 2F, 3G, 3F, 4G and 4F positions. Metal groups include Low Carbon Steel and Aluminum Alloys. Advanced welding in SMAW, PAC, OAC/W, FCAW, GMAW-S, Spray and GTAW welding with interpreting blueprints may make students ready for entry level welding positions. Students must arrive to class on time and remain on task. Time management skills are a must. Employability skills, Integrated Mathematics and English are also part of the welding curriculum. Students are required to provide safety glasses, protective clothing (long sleeve shirt, long pants, close toe shoes or boots) and welding gloves. Prerequisite: Basic Welding.



Qualified Medication Aide Prep (QMA) -

Are you a CNA ready for more responsibility at work? Looking for a way to increase your pay? QMA may be for you! The role of the QMA is to administer prescribed medications and treatments to a, primarily, geriatric population in long-term care centers. 60 hours of classroom learning followed by 40 hours of a supervised clinical experience. are required. Attendance to each is mandatory. Candidates must successfully pass both an English and Math exam. In addition, candidates must obtain a clear background check prior to the first day of class. This is a "Prep" class. Completion of all course requirements and successfully passing the Indiana State Department of Health QMA exam is required for licensure.

Certified Nursing Assistant Preperation (CNA)-

Check back after January 13th for availability

Do you enjoy feeling needed? Do you get along well with elderly people? Then we need YOU! CNA's are the front lines in healthcare. At the end of the day, you can be certain of making a difference in someone's life! This rigorous course requires 30+ hours of classroom learning and 75+ hours of supervised clinical instruction to be eligible to sit for the Indiana State Department of Health CNA exam. Attendance to each class is mandatory. Per ISDH, candidates must successfully pass an English exam. In addition, candidates must obtain a clear background check prior to the first day of class. This is a "Prep" class. Completion of all course requirements and successfully passing the Indiana State Department of Health CNA exam is required for licensure.
