She continues participating in the school newsletter and becomes a middle school volunteer for the Elkhart Culture Series.

When Roxane reaches the 10-12 grade campus, she decides to pursue her studies within the **School of Arts & Communication**.

What this may mean is that she will learn Science standards through reading scientific journals and mirroring experiments, for example. Her electives may include photography, foreign languages, and business, where she will learn tools to help in her future career. This team will help Roxane receive hands-on experience through job shadowing, internships, and work-study.
